Dolphin Watching Tour to the **South Coast**, a nationally protected marine park and national park containing the whitest beaches in the world and home to dolphins and marine life. You'll jump on a cruise to relax and appreciate a truly stunning environment as well as walking on some of the world's whitest sand! Includes a picnic lunch on a glorious beach with some of the whitest sand in the world. After lunch, the tour continues to **Kangaroo Valley**, described as "The most beautiful valley in Australia."
