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Orientation Program	The International Office offers an orientation program for all international students before the start of each semester. We assist students with all formalities, e.g. the registration with local authorities, and introduce them to the various services and systems provided by Leuphana University of Lüneburg, e.g. enrolment, module registration, sports facilities. During the orientation program students are offered advice on module choices by their academic coordinator and a personal tutor.
Travel Opportunities	During the orientation program a sight-seeing tour in Lüneburg, an excursion to Hamburg as well as a three days field trip to Berlin are offered. During the semester there are different excursions to Bremen, Wolfsburg or the seaside and in winter especially to Christmas Markets like in Nuremberg or Dresden.

Language Support	We recommend that incoming students have at least the A2 German proficiency level when coming to Germany, because the main language of instruction is German and the majority of courses will be taught in German.
	We offer pre-sessional intensive German language courses at all levels.
	Please note that no elementary German language classes will be offered during the semester.
	All language classes are free of charge for exchange students.
	The Writing Centre assists students in doing their coursework, writing essays or preparing presentations in German, etc.
	As regards daily life, almost everybody in Germany understands and speaks English.
